SLA with Conyers	£1163.33	All	<p>This agreement has provided us with 11 weeks of teaching from a PE teacher from Conyers. The teacher works alongside the class teachers from Layfield Primary School. The areas for development are identified by staff members. Conyers sports festival package	£430	KS2	The agreement with Conyers School allows us to compete in inter-cluster Level 1 competition against other local schools in a wide range of sports across the school.	To continue to allow children to compete in competitions.
Gymnastic coaching	£1170	All	This allows children exposure to high-quality dedicated gymnastics coaching from specialist providers for children across the school, allowing staff to learn from the specialist teacher in terms of delivery, inclusion and expectation. This is an area that staff have identified they would like to develop further. The higher standard of overall delivery for specialist techniques means that children are able to achieve more highly and a wider range of abilities can be adequately catered for. Transport to and from festivals and sporting events	£311.67	All	This is essential to allow children to attend cluster festivals, galas and other sporting events in order to represent Layfield. Where possible, transport costs are shared with other local schools or alternative ways are sought to transport the children that do not involve a direct cost to the schools (travelling with staff who hold business insurance, for example).	Continue to support the sporting calendar by providing suitable transport.
Outdoor Education	£3205	R-Y5	Children from Reception to Year 5 benefit from taking part in outdoor education provided by an external provider. Children enjoy experiencing activities such as: bush craft, campfire cooking and treasure hunts. This allows children to experience a range of new skills it also forms a part of the KS2 curriculum. Paying for an external provider to deliver these sessions allows the children to receive high quality activities and allows us to use a range of equipment and resources that we do not have on the school site.	To continue to provide outdoor education for KS2 and provide children with these experiences. To evaluate KS1 skills and provide alternative coaching to establish skills ready for KS2.
Extra activities	£236	All	All remaining expenditure will be geared towards improving the sports experience for the children in the school, whether that is through direct participation or by enhanced teacher awareness and subject knowledge.
